He praised the charity's recent initiatives, especially the home assistance program for the elderly and the living allowance for young talents entitled "We help you, you help us". Noemie Gasparini, a rising violonist who benefited from this aid, played a piece by Ernest Chausson to the delight of the attendees before the evening culminated with a live auction led by Antoine Treuille. Here are a few facts about food stamps to remind us of those less fortunate this holiday season:

- Commonly known as "food stamps", the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or SNAP, provides a monthly food stipend for low-income working people, seniors, and the disabled.
- In October 2013, about three million New Yorkers, or about 15% of the New York state population, were SNAP beneficiaries.
- SNAP participants receive a Common Benefit Identification Card CBIC to purchase food at stores authorized by the USDA's Food and Nutrition Service
- 25% of the families we help, are eligible for this program.
