



1878, the year of his death, he was still a member of the same church, the Trinity Episcopal Church of New York City, where he had been a member since 1864.

His grave is in the Trinity Episcopal Churchyard in New York City, near the church's rectory. It is located on the east side of the church, between the church and the rectory. The grave is a simple, rectangular, granite headstone, with the following inscription:

EDWARD GEORGE BROWN, BORN MAY 21, 1812, DIED AUGUST 15, 1878. BURIED AUGUST 17, 1878. HIS WIFE, MARY ANN BROWN, BORN FEBRUARY 10, 1814, DIED FEBRUARY 10, 1882. BURIED FEBRUARY 12, 1882.

His grave is located in the same churchyard as the grave of his wife, Mary Ann Brown. The grave is a simple, rectangular, granite headstone, with the following inscription:



Her name is on the obelisk, along with her birth and death dates. The obelisk is a simple, rectangular, granite monument, with the following inscription:

BORN 1812, DIED 1882, BURYING PLACE OF THE BROWN FAMILY, TRINITY EPISCOPAL CHURCH, NEW YORK CITY.
